

Joint Statement of the members of the Women's Funding Network

July 24, 2019

Women's and Girls' grantmakers, organizations and supporters across the country stand together in condemning the recent vitriol shown towards our country's female elected officials, and in particular, female elected officials of color.

To these attackers and their defenders, we say this:

You do not represent the shared values that move our country forward. These values recognize and embrace leadership from all walks of life, recognizing the strength of diversity.

For more than 100 years, American women have fought to gain our rightful place in our government institutions. We will not back down. You cannot erase our presence, nor keep us from taking our place as leaders of this great democracy.
